Each summer OCENET welcomes students from South America, Asia and Europe who attend international summer camps through the Summer Explorer Program. During the mornings students attend English classes (using the Common European Framework), and then in

the afternoons put their newly acquired English language skills into practice through a wide variety of cultural and physical activities from cycling along the Rideau Canal, to creating dreamcatchers at the Aboriginal Experience at Victoria Island, to learning about Canadian culture at

the many national museums and art galleries in the Ottawa area. The international summer students live with a local Canadian host family so both the visiting students and Ottawa families benefit from a unique and enriching cross-cultural experience.

### OCDSB schools host Chilean "Penguins without Borders"

Throughout 2013 the Government of Canada has demonstrated a growing commitment to strengthening both economic and educational partnerships with Latin America. One development that has evolved from these growing ties is the launch of new program named "Penguins Without Borders" whereby the Chilean gov-

ernment selected 40 Chilean students to attend Canadian high schools this school year for one semester. Four of these students are currently attending OCDSB high schools. For these Chilean students, this initiative will enhance intercultural understanding and promote English language development.

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## OCDSB International Certificate Program expands to more local secondary schools

The pilot of the new International Certificate Program ran throughout the 2012-2013 school year. Almost 100 students from Grade 9-12 are enrolled in the program and 23 graduating students received their certificates at a special reception held at the Korean Embassy in June which was attended by OCDSB Trustee Chair Jennifer Mackenzie and Director of Education Jennifer Adams.

The purpose of this innovative program is "to recognize and

honour students who demonstrate a commitment to being motivated, engaged and active global citizens."

The certificate program requires students to complete three specific components with an emphasis on knowledge of an additional international language including English or French as well as intercultural communication, globally focused courses, and an international engagement and experience activity. A final step involves the crea-

tion and presentation of a portfolio of their learning.

This program has generated a great deal of interest amongst OCDSB students, parents and educators. In addition, local post-secondary institutions are formally recognizing the benefits of this type of program.

In addition to the original pilot high schools of A.Y. Jackson S.S., Bell HS, Gloucester HS, Hillcrest HS, Lisgar CI and Ridgemont HS, an expansion plan has been approved as indicated below:

OCENET is recognized for its superior teacher training programs. Throughout the year, many groups and delegations visit from foreign countries to enhance their professional development and learn about pedagogical innovations practiced in Ontario. One such program is the CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) Teachers' Training Program which hosts teachers from Spain for three weeks in the summer and again in the fall. Spanish teachers learn and practice innovative English language pedagogical methodologies by teaching language development through differentiated communication approaches, reflective teaching, and varied assessment strategies. When not attending classes, teachers have opportunities to attend cultural events and explore the Ottawa area.

The Summer International Leadership Program developed by OCENET is one of a kind. Upon meet with local Canadian students who were specially selected because of their proven leadership skills and their ability to work collaboratively with students from diverse backgrounds. This unique cross-cultural experience with local students of a similar age who reside in the same residential facility 24/7 and participate together in all activities is what truly differentiates

**Emphasis on leadership skills** 

Throughout the program students complete a curriculum that develops the skills essential to strong leaders, such as selfawareness, teamwork, goal setting and decision making, among many others.

The aim of the program is fourfold in that it (I) promotes the development of leadership skills

through engaging "real world" learning activities, (2) enhances English language acquisition through extended interactions with Canadian English-speaking students their own age, (3) develops confidence and maturity through exposure to new challenges based on a sequential learning curriculum that culminates in a model United Nations simulation, and (4) encourages cross-cultural awareness through meaningful interactions with Canadians. Students have opportunities to learn from the example of local leaders they meet and to participate in activities which empower everyone to demonstrate their leadership abilities in a supportive environment.

The success of this new program is evident in the many new friendships that developed and by the noticeable growth in confidence of the participants.
